Year 1 have started there new T4W story - The Gingerbread man. We have started by labelling the Gingerbread man and using adjectives and connectives to make our writing more interesting.










In year 5, we have enjoyed looking at lots of different still life artwork. Here is some of the children having a go at recreating a still life by Picasso.











Children in **Nursery**, have enjoyed making spaceships with boxes and seeing how many children can fit into a box.








Punctuality
